#### NEW RULE CHANGE CONCERNING ACCOUNTS EXAMINERS

Following the change agreed at the 2018 AGM, that the Guild will have one Accounts Examiner instead of two, the relevant rule in the Guild Handbook (Ringers' Rules; Independent Examiners, p.3) will change to: There shall be **one** Independent Examiner, elected annually at the AGM on the recommendation of the Committee. **He or she** will examine all the accounts of the Guild and report on the same to the Committee. **He or she** need not be **a member** of the Guild. (Changed wording shown in bold.) Future editions of the Guild Handbook will be amended to include this wording.

Many long-term members will remember her. I was unable to be at her funeral on September 17th at Sutton-under-Brailes, as I was in London. I hope some FSG members

managed to attend. Jill was a very enthusiastic 'tower-grabber' and I understand she rang at a great number before she had to stop.

#### THE CHAPLAIN'S THOUGHTS

There is now a great shortage of full-time clergy available to fill vacancies for a Rector or Vicar. Bishops have been ordaining the usual numbers of Deacons and Priests, but more than half have been for Non-Stipendary ministry and Self Supporting ministry. Maybe we should value the clergy we have, hoping that they will not retire or move elsewhere. Vacancies in the North of England and in rural Dioceses are taking two or three years to fill. Like clergy in multi-parish Benefices, ringers on a Sunday go to two, or more, Churches. As ringers we must ensure that the clergy know what we achieve, for we can be out of sight and out of mind by the congregation as well as the clergy.

When we hold a bellringers' meeting we should try to make sure that the Vicar or a Churchwarden is invited to attend. At a Bellringers' Supper or Dinner, we could invite the Vicar to attend.

Every band of ringers should try to get one of the ringers to serve on the Parochial Church Council (PCC) of the Church. This would help keep the ringers informed of any plans to re-order the interior of the Church. It would also save what has happened in parishes where the PCC has plans to put toilets and kitchens into ground-floor ringing rooms and thought that half of the bellropes could be pulled over by six or seven feet, thinking that the bells are chimed rather than rung full-circle. Fortunately, Diocesan Advisory Committees (DAC) are now better informed and any Faculty petition to do this is rejected.\*

Our ringing can be thought of as missioned activity, for it can bring people into Church buildings that otherwise might not venture in. Bellringing has been described as a great noise for God, for it is worship in itself. There is evidence that in town and city churches the number of visitors who enter the buildings increases while a peal in being rung. More decide to look in to see what is happening than when the tower is silent.

#### **Rev Dr Peter Newing**

(\*Peter's point about ringers being more involved with proposed modifications in churches to give better facilities is well made. Yes, DAC involvement is very useful indeed and usually many problems regarding bells and ringing are avoided. Sadly this is not always so, as sometimes a faculty application slips through the net, even in well-organised DACs. I was asked to advise on proposals at a church to install a new access ladder assembly from the Ringing Room to the belfry, as the Ringing Master was concerned the details included plans to add pulleys to two 'straight-drop' ropes to provide a kink in the rope drop to allow greater clearance for the structure. Apparently a preliminary inspection of the plans was approved in principle by a DAC Advisor involved,, which I found puzzling. I investigated at DAC level and learnt that, through an error in the DAC office, the plans had been sent only to an Advisor concerned with building implications, not to the Bells Advisor. Happily, the plans for the structure were modified very successfully to fit in with the ropes, and ringing the easy-going bells continues. Sometimes, of course, modifications beyond 'List A' are made without reference to the DAC or to the Archdeacon, and this is where real problems occur. Such modifications can be ringer-led, or PCC-led. In such cases the PCC can be forced to return the modified items to their original state at their expense if found unacceptable to the Diocese. CMP)

Many attended and we had many compliments regarding the choice of menu and the service. The after-dinner Speaker was Martin Penny, who gave an interesting talk. He drew upon the way in which women were drawn into undertaking men's roles in particularly WW1 and again in WW2. He likened this to the way ringing has changed from effectively all-male until the present day. The prize giving followed the talk, with the trophies presented by the President John Nicholls, the Vice Presidents Peter Newing and Freda Cleaver, and the Ringing Master Richard Lewis-Skeath.

To continue giving grants to worthy applications we must maintain our funding, otherwise our grants will be too small to make a useful contribution to a project.
