MALCOLM STEWART 1939 - 2019: RIP

Malcolm was a founder member of the Guild. He attended the preliminary meeting in March 1973 organised by Tony Brazier at the Church Rooms in Chipping Campden. This meeting was to gauge support for re-founding the FSG. A proposal was made to re-found it and there was plenty of support. Malcolm was one of the first members. On the 40th anniversary of this meeting in 2013 the Committee decided to confer HLF status on those founding members who were left. With Malcolm's passing, only four remain.

Malcom assisted Tony with various practical things FSG-wise, most notably the clear-out of Saintbury belfry prior to a test ring to determine whether the bells at that time could be rung. The belfry was in an horrendous state, with twigs brought in by birds over very many years up to half-way up the waists of the bells (another helping was Clint Evans, who was also a founder member and HLF). The test ring didn't progress, as the bell frame was in a very poor state and things were left. Luckily, of course, Saintbury bells entered a new chapter a few years later, being rehung in modern style and then augmented to 8. The photo on the front page shows Malcolm and Tony together in Saintbury at the clear-out.

Hilary mentions that Malcolm used to be part of the regular team at Badsey, especially for Service ringing as well as looking after the churchyard with Clint Evans and John Bolton. He was always a willing handy man.

WALK & RING, September 21st 2019

We were welcomed at Tredington by a wonderful array of refreshments, tea, coffee and lovely home-made cakes. Please may I pass on my warm congratulations to the volunteers who provided this spread. It made a wonderful start to our tour.

THE CHAPLAIN'S THOUGHTS (for Jan 2020 Newsletter)

I was recently in Lichfield Cathedral and remember ringing there when stationed in the RAF at Hednesford on Cannock Chase while engaged in so-called 'squarebashing'. One of the Rugeley ringers, Mr Joyner (?), ferried me to one or two towers for which I was very grateful. Bell ringers tend to be very welcoming, which means that whenever we go to a tower we are made welcome. This means that we have friends all over the country who are universally encouraging, accommodating and helpful. While stationed at RAF West Drayton I hitch-hiked to ring at many towers, some quite long distances away such as Bath and Wells, and many in the Oxford area.

Certainly there is some disconnection between what may be called advanced method ringing and everyday ringing, for ringing does span a whole range of levels. Quite often, soon after mastering the handling of a bell and ringing rounds, we find ourselves helping others reaching that standard. Maybe only a few moments later other more experienced ringers are standing behind us as we make further progress.

Young ringers going at 18 to College or University find that from not knowing anyone in a strange town that they have immediate friends in the local tower. It has been said that Admission tutors when interviewing prospective students are favourable to applicants who state bell ringing as one of their interests or hobbies. This may be because ringers are known for their friendliness and for their intellectual skill in mastering change ringing and for their dedication.

40 YEARS AGO

2nd January 1980:

Committee Meeting held at Badsey Fields Road on 22nd January 1980 at 7.30

All members present

The Minutes were read and signed by the Guild Master as a correct record of the previous meeting

Matters Arising from the Minutes:

Donation to Whichford. Mr Carter reported offering the Tower Captain £1 for the stay which was broken at a Saturday practice. The offer was refused, so a donation to the Church was suggested

Campaign/Open Afternoon:

A J Brazier suggested a Journal write-up and Mr Fairfax offered to contact a reporter. The following items are to be on display at the Tower: Newsletters, Ringing Worlds, Cup and Shield, Scrap book. The following Committee members have offered to be at the Tower: Mr Fairfax, AJ Brazier, J Nicholls, J White, and Mrs P Linsdell. It was stressed that the Committee work hard to bring a good number of interested people.

Bell Fund (Bell maintenance, repairing, replacing overhauling):

AJ Brazier explained the reason for considering a Bell Fund. He said it would be completely separate from the Guild with the possibility of its own Committee: The Fund would rely on donations. He ended by offering to compile a report

Annual Dinner:

Mr Fairfax said that Mr & Mrs Wratten would be unable to come due to a prior engagement. He proposed asking Mr Wratten to come next year instead, seconded by AJ Brazier and carried.

The replica Shield has been ordered, but may be slightly different from last year's. The cost is about £5.

Peals:

AJ Brazier proposed encouraging members to credit peals to the Guild. Seconded by J Nicholls and carried.

Treasurer's Report:

The Treasurer reported having settled the Ringing World's account for the Guild for 1978 but not 1979. AJ Brazier proposed accepting the Treasurer's figures as correct, and carried.

Signatures for Cheques and Building Society:

AJ Brazier proposed that the Guild Master and Treasurer complete the forms for change of signatures as forms require. Seconded by P Harmer and carried.

Amendment to the Rules:

AJ Brazier felt that any member paid up for the previous five yeas should, on reaching 60 years, become an honorary member. He suggested that under Membership iii should now read: 'i ,Persons, who have reached the age of 65 years and have taken part in the activities of the Guild prior to 1940, ii been a paid-up ringing member for the previous five years are entitled to become an Honorary Life Member upon application to the Secretary'. This proposal will go forward to the AGM.

Any Other Business:

P Harmer reported that Cleeve Prior Tower are very keen to be included in the FSG area. This produced a long discussion about 'The Area', which was then postponed until the next meeting called to deal with the question.

<u>Bell Fund:</u> AJ Brazier asked the Committee to read the 'Bell Restoration Fund' leaflet obtained from the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers, to consider the feasibility and implications of beginning such a Fund.

<u>Open Afternoon:</u> The Open Afternoon organisation is as follows: S Carter to be in charge of ringing; MF Fairfax and AJ Brazier will explain bellringing; Mrs P Linsdell in charge of tea and coffee. A small display of articles connected with bellringing will be on show.

<u>The Guild Boundary</u>: after a lengthy discussion as to where our boundary is, the extra-territorial boundary and the possibility of including new towers in 'our area' the Committee decided to keep the Area as defined on the map published in the Newsletter from time to time. FROM THE ARCHIVES:- 100 YEARS AGO

There was no entry in the Old Minute Book for this period 100 years ago.

Striking competition

Due to the reduction of the newsletter the Autumn archives for 100 years ago were not researched, interestingly after a lapse of 5 1/2 years the striking competitions were recommenced at 2pm at Saintbury, on October the 29th, 1919 the weather was unfavourable but there was a fair number of members present and 4 towers took part in the events, namely Blockley, Campden, Shipston and Willersey. Mr J Williams of Longbourough was appointed judge and the results were as follows:-

Minutes of the 2019 Annual General Meeting

The Annual General Meeting of the Four Shires Guild of Bell Ringers was held on Saturday 19th October 2019 in Guiting Power Village Hall, following the Striking Competitions and the Guild Service held in St Michael's Church, Guiting Power. The President, John Nicholls, was in the Chair, accompanied by Vice-President Freda Cleaver. Members attending numbered 24. Handouts of the agenda, Minutes of the 2018 AGM, Guild accounts and the Guild Master's report were available (all had appeared in various Guild Newsletters during the year).

1 Results of the Striking Competitions:

There were two teams competing for the Newing Shield (plus one 'scratch' team) and four teams competing for the Brazier Trophy. The judge was Martin Mellor from Burbage, near Hinkley, Leics.

The Brazier Trophy competition:.

1st Willersey (B) 33 faults (awarded Brazier Cup)

The Newing Shield competition:-

1st Ilmington ((PB Doubles) 6 faults overall awarded the Newing Shield. Judged as 'enjoyable throughout'.

2nd Pebworth/Offenham (PB Doubles) 8 faults overall awarded the Spencer Jones Cup 'Scratch' (ineligible for placing) 9 faults overall (rang Cambridge S Minor)

The Ringing Master (Richard Lewis-Skeath) will give The Merit Award to the team which, in his view, has made the most significant progress during the year. (To be announced)

The awards will be presented at the Guild's Annual Dinner in February 2018

- 3 <u>Minutes of the Last Meeting:</u> These were published in the January 2018 Newsletter (nr 155) and were taken as read. The Minutes were accepted as a true record and were signed as such by the Chairman.
- 4 Matters arising: There was none.
- 5 <u>Guild Master's Report 2017-2018:</u> taken as read and accepted. There was nothing arising.
- 6 <u>Treasurer's Report:</u> The draft Guild accounts to 31st December 2017 appeared in the April 2018 Newsletter (no 156). The accounts have been examined and the final accounts were included in the AGM hand-out, together with a written report on the finances by the Treasurer, Michael Dane. Nothing of note was discovered. The Examiner has already signed them off. It was proposed by Andrew Fleming, seconded by Nick Allsopp, that the accounts be adopted: carried.

7 <u>Election of President and Vice-Presidents (to serve for 3 years):</u>

It was proposed by Richard Lewis-Skeath and seconded by Nick Allsopp that the present incumbents of

these positions be re-elected en bloc. There were no other candidates proposed, these members were re-elected

8 Election of Officers (Guild Master, Ringing Master, Hon Secretary, Hon Treasurer)

<u>Guild Master:</u> Peter Quinn was prop Chris Povey and sec John Nicholls. There being no other candidates, Peter was re-elected.

<u>Ringing Master:</u> Richard Lewis-Skeath was prop John Carroll and sec Jackie Hands. There being no other candidates, Richard was re-elected.

<u>Secretary:</u> Chris Povey was prop Andrew Fleming and sec John Nicholls. There being no other candidates, Chris was re-elected.

<u>Treasurer:</u> Michael Dane was prop Richard Lewis-Skeath and sec John Nicholls. There being no other candidates. Michael was re-elected.

9 <u>Election of the Committee and Accounts Examiners:</u> The existing six Committee members were asked if they were content to be re-elected. They were. It was prop by Andrew Fleming, sec by Jackie Roberts, that they be re-elected en bloc: carried.

<u>Accounts Examiner</u>: Robert Hall said he would be happy to continue in this role. Robert was prop Chris Povey and sec by Christina Ireland. There being no other nominations, Robert was re-elected.

10 Election of two Central Council representatives (to serve for 3 years).
